

The Robert and Maude Gledden Senior Visiting Fellowships – Call for 2018 Applications

The Robert and Maude Gledden Senior Visiting Fellowships are part of the estate bequeathed to the University by the late Robert John Gledden to promote and encourage education and research at the University in the disciplines of applied science, more particularly relating to surveying, engineering, mining or cognate subjects. The purpose of the fellowship is to provide travel costs and living expenses for accommodation for scholars outside of Western Australia.

The Senior Visiting Fellowships are open to researchers who have doctoral degrees or equivalent qualifications or experience, and who are mid-career or senior researchers.

Remuneration

Senior Visiting Fellowships provide a round trip economy airfare and approximately AUD\$1500 per week inclusive of accommodation and a modest living allowance for up to a maximum of 90 days. Funding is not provided for accompanying family.

Applications

Senior Visiting Fellowships are offered annually. Applications normally open in January or February, and close in August of the year preceding the proposed visit. Applications are assessed by the Gledden Visiting Fellowships Committee and applicants will be notified by the end of September in the year preceding the proposed visit. Applications that do not relate to the fields of surveying, engineering, mining or cognate subjects will not be considered. Applications must be lodged by a UWA-based researcher.

Terms and Conditions

Gledden Senior Visiting Fellows

- Agree to cite UWA and acknowledge the Fellowship in publications resulting from this award;
- Acknowledge that any IP resulting in commercialisation from this collaboration will be negotiated at an appropriate time following UWA Guidelines;
- Agree to provide a final report and participate in periodic surveys by the Institute of Advanced Studies requesting follow-up information on research outcomes that have resulted from the Fellowship;
- Provide a public lecture and/or masterclass for the Institute of Advanced Studies; and
- Provide a letter from their home institution, granting leave and advising that the Fellow will return to the home institution at the completion of the visit.

Additional Information

- The period of tenure of a fellowship is a minimum of fourteen days and a maximum of ninety days.
- Health and travel insurance are not provided as part of the Fellowship. Fellows must also provide evidence of health and travel insurance as part of acceptance of the award.
- The University is closed for two weeks over Christmas and Fellows should not arrange residency at UWA during that period.
- Provision is made to defer the Fellowship once.
- Research facilities, infrastructure and equipment will be provided by the School, Discipline, or relevant research group.
- It is expected that the host will be available for the duration of the Fellow's visit to UWA.
